LIFT is a multidisciplinary care program for patients with intestinal failure aiming to rehabilitate their remaining bowel capacity, optimize home parenteral nutrition and to treat complications. The program involves gastroenterologists, transplant surgeons, intestinal failure surgeons, vascular access surgeons, nutrition and vascular access specialist nurses, pharmacists, pathologists and dietitians.
